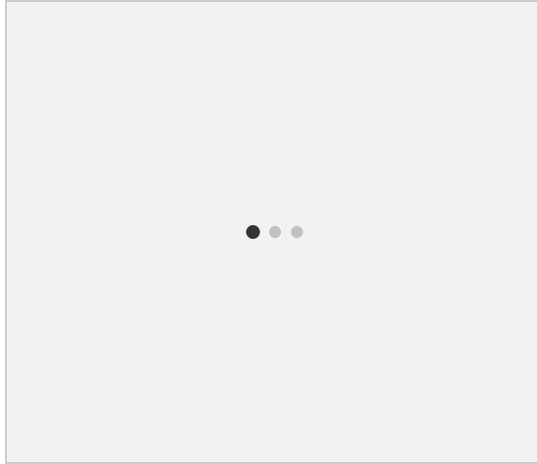


Chokecherry

1. Shrub, tree, plant, or grass: Shrub²
2. Perennial or annual: Perennial³
3. Plant Height: 20 to 30 feet⁴
4. Bloom period: April to July⁵
5. Pollinators they attract: Butterflies (California Hairstreak)⁶
6. Edible to Humans: Yes, if ripe⁷
7. Classification on endangered species list: N/A
8. Harbouring pests: Aphids⁸
9. Soil type requirements: Sand, loam, clay⁹
10. Soil pH requirements: 6.8 to 7.2¹⁰
11. Plants hardiness zone: 2 to 7¹¹
12. Wet/dry requirements: Dry to moist¹²
13. Watering: N/A
14. Shade/Sun Requirements: Full sun to full shade¹³
15. Precautions: Any parts of the shrub that are new growth, injured, or wilted are poisonous. If it is immature, don't eat.¹⁴ Susceptible to X-disease, black knot, stem decay, shothole, Valsa canker, and honey fungus.¹⁵
