1. Shrub, tree, plant, or grass: Shrub²
2. Perennial or annual: Perennial³
3. Plant Height: 3 to 10 feet⁴ (Species dependant)
4. Bloom period: May to June, September⁵
5. Pollinators they attract: Butterflies, bees, hummingbirds⁶, and caterpillars⁷
6. Edible to Humans: Edible⁸
7. Classification on endangered species list: N/A
8. Harbouring pests: Aphids, beetles, mites, thrips, rose scale, leafhopper, slugs, and grasshoppers⁹
9. Soil type requirements: Loam¹⁰
10. Soil pH requirements: 6 to 7¹¹
11. Hardiness zone: 4 to 11¹² (Species dependant)
12. Wet/dry requirements: N/A (needs mulch)¹³
13. Watering: Water per week¹⁴
14. Shade/Sun Requirements: Full sun¹⁵
15. Precautions: Powdery mildew and black spot¹⁶
16. Companions: Lavender, catnip, lady's mantle, tall growing pinks, heliotropes, summer snap-dragon, lantana, verbena, million bells petunia, and onion family species¹⁷
